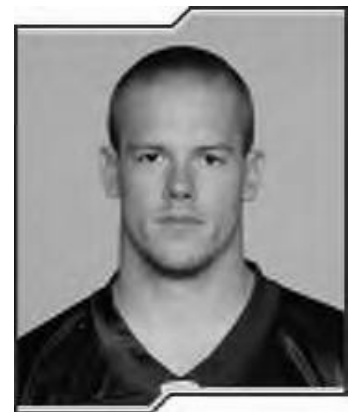

Peelle elected VP of Massachusetts Medical Society

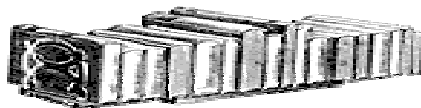
Kenneth R. Peelle, M.D., a North Andover resident and board-certified radiologist at Saints Memorial Medical Center in Lowell, was elected vice president of the Massachusetts Medical Society at the organization's annual meeting Thursday, May 13 at the Seaport Hotel in Boston. He will serve a one-year term as one of the top officers of the statewide membership organization representing some 18,000 physicians, residents, and medical students.

Peelle joined the Massachusetts Medical Society in 1975. From 2000-2003, he served as the Speaker of the House of Delegates, the Society's governing body, and from 1997-2000 he was Vice Speaker of the House. He is a member and past president of the Middlesex North District Medical Society, one of 20 district societies comprising the state organization.

At Saints Memorial Medical Center, he has been active in the leadership of the hospital since its formation in 1992 by the merger of St. Joseph's and St. John's hospitals. He has served as the chief and vice chief of the Radiology Department at Saints and as president and vice president of the medical staff. At St. Joseph's Hospital he also served as radiology chief and medical staff president.

In his medical specialty of radiology, Peelle is a member and past president of the Massachusetts Radiological Society and a member of the American Roentgen Ray Society, the Radiological Society of North America. Peelle was accepted into the American College of Radiology in 1975, serving as a councilor and alternate councilor. He became a fellow of the College in 1990.

A native of Rock Stream and current resident of North Andover, Peelle earned his B.A. and M.D. from Cornell University, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He served his internship at the University of Vermont Medical Center, and his residency in diagnostic radiology at The New York Hospital.

Now this... (from my book)

In 1996, there were four descendants who were registered as *Daughters of The American Revolution* as direct descendants of **Robert**. The interesting thing about their **DAR** applications is that each time the above phrase was used someone drew a wavy line through the words and entered the hand-written words "*paid for services rendered*" just below. Another entry states "*raised to pay fines for Quaker.*" The current DAR members, claiming to be descendant of Robert, are as follows:

Our records do not support the claim of Mrs. Van Tuyl who claimed membership based upon **Elizabeth Peelle** (1736-1818), daughter of **Robert Peelle** (1709-1782) being married to an Elisha Parker. This is an error. Elizabeth married Arthur Bryant and was raising a family at the same time that Mrs. Van Tuyl had Elizabeth married to Elisha Parker. *The National Society Daughters of the American Revolution* answered our query on this subject on October 2, 1997 with the following "*In this case, we do agree that Elizabeth who married Elisha is probably incorrect, and we have adjusted our records accordingly.*"

# Memorial Day

It was 1866 and the United States was recovering from the long and bloody Civil War between the North and the South. Surviving soldiers came home, some with missing limbs, and all with stories to tell. Henry Welles, a drugstore owner in Waterloo, New York, heard the stories and had an idea. He suggested that all the shops in town close for one day to honor the soldiers who were killed in the Civil War and were buried in the Waterloo cemetery. On the morning of May 5, the townspeople placed flowers, wreaths and crosses on the graves of the Northern soldiers in the cemetery. At about the same time, Retired Major General Jonathan A. Logan planned another ceremony, this time for the soldiers who survived the war. He led the veterans through town to the cemetery to decorate their comrades' graves with flags. It was not a happy celebration, but a memorial. The townspeople called it **Decoration Day**.

In Retired Major General Logan's proclamation of Memorial Day, he declared: *"The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country and during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land. In this observance no form of ceremony is prescribed, but posts and comrades will in their own way arrange such fitting services and testimonials of respect as circumstances may permit."*

The two ceremonies were joined in 1868, and northern states commemorated the day on May 30. The southern states commemorated their war dead on different days. Children read poems and sang civil war songs and veterans came to school wearing their medals and uniforms to tell students about the Civil War. Then the veterans marched through their hometowns followed by the townspeople to the cemetery. They decorated graves and took photographs of soldiers next to American flags. Rifles were shot in the air as a salute to the northern soldiers who had given their lives to keep the United States together.

In 1882, the name was changed to **Memorial Day** and soldiers who had died in previous wars were honored as well. In the northern United States, it was designated a public holiday. In 1971, along with other holidays, President Richard Nixon declared Memorial Day a federal holiday on the last Monday in May.

Cities all around the United States hold their own ceremonies on the last Monday in May to pay respect to the men and women who have died in wars or in the service of their country.

Memorial Day is not limited to honor only those Americans from the armed forces. It is also a day for personal remembrance. Families and individuals honor the memories of their loved ones who have died. Church services, visits to the cemetery, flowers on graves or even silent tribute mark the day with dignity and solemnity. It is a day of reflection. However, to many Americans the day also signals the beginning of summer with a three-day weekend to spend at the beach, in the mountains or at home relaxing.

In Waterloo, New York, the origin has not been lost and in fact the meaning has become even more special. President Lyndon Johnson proclaimed Waterloo the birthplace of Memorial Day in 1966, 100 years after the first commemoration. Every May 30, townspeople still walk to the cemeteries and hold memorial services. They decorate the graves with flags and flowers. Then they walk back to the park in the middle of town. In the middle of the park, near a monument dedicated to soldiers, sailors and marines, the Gettysburg address is read, followed by Retired Major General Logan's Order #11 designating Decoration Day. The village choirs sing patriotic songs. In the evening, school children take part in a parade.

Some southern states continue to celebrate Memorial Day on various days, i.e. June 3rd in Louisiana and Tennessee called "*Confederate Memorial Day*" and on May 10th in North and South Carolina.

Present or accounted for until mustered out on Nov 13, 1861 at Raleigh, NC. Later served as a Private in Companies B and C, Third Battalion North Carolina Light Artillery. Enlisted in Company B in Bertie County on April 19, 1862. Present or accounted for until transferred to Company C on February 14, 1863. Detailed to Quartermaster Department at Fort Carswell ~ Brunswick County, NC in Mar-Apr 1864. Absent detailed through October 1864 date of last available muster roll. Reported as absent without leave when paroled at Greensboro, NC on April 28, 1865.

This is an entry from the log of the **United States Ship Constitution** entered in the years 1779-1780, which relates to the supply management facet of the logistics engineering discipline. The excerpt is as follows:

*"On the 23d of August 1779, the United States Ship Constitution set sail from Boston. She left with 475 officers and men, 48,600 gallons of fresh water, 7400 cannon shot, 11,600 pounds of black powder, and 76,400 gallons of rum on board. Her mission was to destroy and harass English shipping. Making Jamaica on 6 October, she took on 826 pounds of flour and 68,300 gallons of rum. Then she headed for the Azores, arriving there on 12 November. She provisioned with 550 pounds of beef and 64,300 gallons of Portuguese wine. On 18 November she set sail for England. In the ensuing days she defeated five British Men-Of-War and captured and scuttled twelve English Merchantmen. By 27 January her powder and shot were exhausted. Unarmed, she made a raid on the Firth of Clyde. Her landing party captured a whiskey distillery and transferred 40,000 gallons on board by dawn. Then she headed home.*

*The Constitution arrived in Boston Harbor on 20 February 1780 with no cannon shot... no powder... no food... no rum... no whiskey... but with 48,000 gallons of stagnant water..."*

This figures out to: 249,000 gallons of rum, wine, or whiskey

**Horace Peele**, along with **Pete Austin**, has done a tremendous amount of research, on our Peele line. Some of Pete's information, with acknowledgment to Horace, can be found online at the above web page. However, according to letters I receive, many of you do not have access to the Internet. So I would like to publish some of this work in the next few issues of the newsletter.

*The children of Robert Peele (b 1709) and Elizabeth Edgerton were Robert Peele (b 1730 married 1 Margaret Jossey and 2 Catherine Fitzgerald); Pasco Isaac Peele (b 1733 married Tabitha Dunigan); Elizabeth Peele (b 1736, married Arthur Bryant); Mary Peele, (b 1741/42 married Thomas Hollowell); and Sarah Peele (b 1746, married David Newsom)*

(1) **Robert Peele Jr**, b. 09-15-1730, Nansemond County VA. He married (1) **Margaret B Jossey**, 9/05/1753 in Northampton Co NC, b. 06-12-1732, Edge County NC, d. 09-21-1796, Wayne County NC. He married (2) **Catherine Fitzgerald**, c1797, in Edgecombe County NC, b.1735, d. bef 10-1814, Edge County NC. Robert died bef 1808, Edge. County.NC.

Children of Robert Peele and Margaret Jossey Peele are:

(a) **David Peele**, b. 1754, Northampton County NC. He married Priscilla Fletcher, 02-09-1794, b. 10-30-1771, Wayne County NC, d. 11-16-1807, Wayne County NC. David died 04-25-1807, Wayne County NC. David died before his father (c1808 Edge County, NC) & mentioned his grandson Fletcher Peele as son of David.

*Note: names were spelled as Peele in father's court records.*

His father Robert Peele Jr. was born in Nansemond County Va. and migrated to Northampton County NC. David moved to Wayne County NC before 1901 when his son Robert was born there on Feb. 25th.

(b) **Christian Peele**, b. 02-21-1757, Northampton County NC. She married Joseph Hall, 11-21-1772, in Northampton County NC. Christian died 1806, Jefferson County Ohio.

(c) **Mary Peele**, b. c1750's? d. aft. 1807.

(d) **Jesse Peele**, b. 03-29-1759, Northampton County NC. He married (1) Patience Vick, 01-11-1783, in Wayne County NC. He married (2) Mary (2nd wife Jesse Peele Jesse died 02-1818, Johnston County NC.

(e) **Willis Peele**, b. 07-14-1837, Bartholomew County In. He married (1) Asenath C Wakefield, 01-06-1859, in Bartholomew County IN, b. 02-04-1838, d. 03-03-1866, Bartholomew County IN, buried: Sand Creek Quaker Cemetery. He married (2) Alice "Ann" Burdg, 10-16-1878, b. 04-14-1852, d. aft 1929. Willis died 11-07-1929, Hollywood CA.

*For the consideration of love, good will and affection which I have and do bear unto my son **Josiah Peele** do hereby give 150 acres with all the houses, orchards, gardens, which I purchased from **William Grimes** between Cashie Branch and Wattom Marsh (Swamp) reserving it for my lifetime. Also to my four younger daughters **Absolutely, Elizabeth, Mary and Penny "Peninah" Peele** all of my livestock and household furniture. Use reserved to my wife during her life.*

*Witnessed: **Jno. Lawrence, John Higgs.***

Feb Ct 1775. **John Johnston** Clerk of Court. Deed BK M page 160.

On Nov.1, 1777. my (Pete Austin's) 5th grandfather **Joshua Peele** wrote a Deed of consideration *For love, good will and affection (have copy) and do bear towards my beloved grandson "**Henry Peele**" son of **James Peele** of the same province and county do freely give 60 acres whereon **William Rogers** now lives which was part of a tract formerly granted to **Thomas Wilson** and by him elapsed and then patented to **Peter West** on 7 April 1730, joining Grate (Great) Swamp Branch that falls into Cashy Swamp. The said **Joshua Peele** does not give up the land until said Henry comes of age or unless said Joshua should die before that time. **James Peele** the father of the said Henry acknowledges the same in a declaration of trust. **Witnessed: Joseph Home, Mary Cartwright,** May Court 1778. **John Johnston** Clerk of Court. Bertie County Deed BK M pages 352.*

**Hugh Buckner Johnson** relates to **John Peele** that although a Quaker he was apparently a Patriot during the Revolution War because records show that Robert Smythe, Paymaster of the Army in North Carolina allowed 118.6.0 pounds for supplies since December 1775.
